To The Galatians,

I am happy you believe in Jesus, but all your fighting is getting in the way! You are not living in the way the Holy Spirit tells us to live. I suggest you live with the Fruit of the Spirit in mind. Show love, joy, peace and patience with one another. Be gentle with one another and always show good self-control. Live with the fruit of the Spirit in mind. The way for you to get long and be a Church is to let God's love fill you.
