Preschool Sunday School At-Home Lesson:
"Doubting Thomas"

Scripture:

**"...Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."
-John 20:29**

The disciples were hiding in a house when Jesus appeared to them, "Peace be with you." Thomas was the only disciple not there. When Thomas returned the others told him about His visit. Thomas didn't believe them. A week later the disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Jesus appears again and says, "Peace be with you." Then Jesus turns to Thomas and shows him his hands, "Put your hand on my wound, it is time for you to believe." Thomas fell to his knees and said, "My Lord, My God." Jesus answers him, "Because you have seen you believe, blessed are those who have yet seen but believe."



Family Conversations
