Preschool Sunday School At-Home Lesson:

"Paul's Letters"

The Story of Apostle Paul:

A young Pharisee named Saul was mean to people who believed in God & Jesus. Even though he was mean, God had plans for Saul. Saul decided to listen, turn his life around and change his ways. Saul and Jesus became friends. Saul was baptized and changed his name to Paul and served God for the rest of his life. Pauls' job as an apostle was to tell the story of Jesus to everyone he met. He traveled all over and started many Churches with people who believed in Jesus. Paul would later be imprisoned for telling others about Jesus. When Paul was unable to travel he wrote letters to share God's love.

Here is an example of Paul's letters:

To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be His Holy People,

There are three things I tell others who have never heard of Jesus or God.

- 1. Jesus was human (like us) and Divine (God). Both at the same time!
- 2. Jesus came so people would know how much God loves us!
- 3. Believing in Jesus and knowing God's love changes your life.

Discuss Word Definitions:

Apostle - early Christian teacher or messenger of God

Pharisee - religious group who could be unfriendly toward other groups
