Love, Joy, Peace & Patience

In the Bible Paul talks about fruit but it's a different kind of fruit, it's called **The Fruit of the Spirit.** The fruit of the Spirit is a little like real fruit because they are each special and different too. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Let's learn more about each fruit.

Love is one of the easiest fruits to explain, think of someone that loves you no matter what. You can make mistakes and it doesn't matter what you look like, but they still love you. God loves us too, no matter what. God & Jesus help us love others too.

Joy is like being very, very happy, it's being happy inside even when things aren't going great. Joy helps us to know God is always with us and all will be well.

Peace is a special feeling of calmness inside of us even when things are not ok. This is the peace we get when we get to know God really well (by reading the Bible, praying, & asking questions) If we have this peace we will feel a calmness in your heart.

Patience is having the ability to wait on something without getting upset or annoyed. Having patience means you stay calm with your emotions and your actions while you wait. It also means to be patient for answers to prayers.
